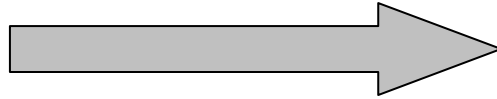


Proving Identity and U.S. Citizenship: Documents That Will Work*

First-level Documents
U.S. Passport
Certificate of Naturalization (form N-550/N-570)
Certificate of Citizenship (form N-560/N-561)

One of these

Adequate documentation

Documents that prove identity
A government-issued ID card w/picture or identifying info
Certificate of Indian Blood or other US tribal documentation
US military card or draft record; military dependent's ID
School ID w/picture

U.S. Public Record of Birth (US birth certificate)	Extract of US hospital record of birth on hospital letterhead from 5 years prior to application date	Federal or state Census record showing US citizenship or US place of birth & age
U.S. Citizen ID card (INS form FS-545/FS-240/DS-1350)	Life, health or other insurance record showing US birthplace from 5 years prior to application date	Admission paperwork from an institution indicating US birthplace from 5 years prior to application date
Final Adoption Decree showing child's name & US place of birth		Medical record stating US place of birth from 5 years prior to application date
Other:		Two written affidavits: one unrelated; both able to prove their own citizenship
