Commonwealth Care Health Insurance Program (for those under 100% of federal income guidelines)

Commonwealth Care is an insurance program for adults 19 years of age and older who do not have health insurance (see exceptions at bottom of the page).

Benefits:

- Hospitalizations
- Physicals and regular check-ups
- Emergency Care
- Prescriptions
- Vision and Dental
- Mental Health and Substance Abuse services

How much does it cost:

- Coverage is free for people under 100% of federal income guidelines
- Only co-pays are \$1 - \$3 for prescriptions.

Eligibility:

- Must be a US citizen or legal residents
- Income is under 100% of federal poverty

Application Process: apply using a form called a MBR (Member Benefit Request), this is the same form used to apply for MassHealth, Healthy Start, Children's Medical Security and Free Care. You will need to provide proof of identity and income. Once approved you must sign up with one of four managed care organizations (MCO) Neighborhood Health Plan, Boston HealthNet, Network Health or Fallon
